

1. General

- 2.2 The volunteer is expected to conduct themselves according to the teaching of Jesus Christ. This means amongst others:
- 2.3 Reliability and integrity characterise the way in which the volunteer acts towards others, especially those who ask and need help.
- 2.4 The attitude of the volunteer towards the person in need is based on respect and acknowledgement of the own responsibility and making choices.

2. Particular

- 2.2 Volunteers give help on behalf of their own church. They will uphold the rules of their church, congregation to which they have connected themselves to give help.
- 2.3 Through HiP volunteers get a liability insurance. (when you break something) Also HiP provides volunteers with a Wegam insurance (this means injury caused when driving a motor vehicle) When a volunteer has offered to transport people, they will need to take out a passengers insurance.
- 2.4 Volunteers will not be bribed, nor accept personal inheritance, resulting from their position as caregiver. Volunteers will be reserved in receiving gifts or presents (facilities or privileges) for themselves. Volunteers will not accept gifts or presents that outgo propriety personally, but will donate these gifts to the church. When in doubt, volunteers will consult the contact person for HiP from the church.
- 2.5 Volunteers will also be reserved in offering gifts, because this may harm mutual independence.
 - Volunteers will consider all that is said to them in their duty as caregiver, as confidential, unless the law obliges them to report.
- 2.6 When volunteers find that the situation is different than they were led to believe, they will immediately contact the deacon of the church. The deacon can, with the help of HiP, offer further aid.
- 2.7 When volunteers, either they themselves or others present, are faced with sexual intimidation and / or violence, or the threat of either, they should immediately leave and report this to the HiP office. Of course, the police can be called in when the situation justifies it. HiP will inform the contact person of the church when professional aid organisations request help.
